IMPLEMENTATION

With support from the TAY SoS Partnership, 5 pilot agencies are currently implementing and evaluating the TIP Model. 40 agencies are working towards implementation. Different agencies have varying levels of capacity and are engaged in other initiatives for youth.

Staff Satisfaction surveys from 5 pilot agencies suggest that service providers are finding the TIP Model beneficial for youth and that it is being well implemented.
